How will healthcare change on January 1, 2014? How will *your practice* change? Hear from leading experts including:

Beth Capell, Ph.D. -- Dr. Capell is a principal with Capell & Associates, which provides policy analysis, legislative advocacy, and other strategic input to consumer, labor and public interest organizations on health care issues.

Mitchell H. Katz, M.D. -- As Director of the Los Angeles County Department of Health Services, Dr. Katz oversees 21,000 employees in a health care system of acute hospitals, multiservice specialty centers, community health clinics and the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Agency. Prior to joining DHS, Dr. Katz served as the Director of Health in San Francisco City and County.

James Stephens, D.D.S. -- The President Elect of the California Dental Association, Dr. Stephens has worked on improving access to oral health care for underserved populations.

Ron Zodkaevitch, M.D. -- Dr. Zodkaevitch has practiced adult, child, and forensic psychiatry in private practice and clinical settings for more than twenty-five years. Dr. Zodkaevitch is the founder and CEO of Universal Health Care Resources, Inc. and has served as the Regional Medical Director for several large behavioral management health care organizations.



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TARGET AUDIENCE: This activity is intended for all Physicians, Dentists and Podiatrists. There are no prerequisites.

EDUCATION NEEDS: Because there is a lack of training for physicians about the specifics of Obamacare, doctors are uncertain about how their practices will change in January 2014, when nationwide 40 million newly insured patients will begin seeking medical care. In light of the uncertainty, a significant number plan to reduce their hours or retire, exacerbating the physician shortage. Doctors need to better understand how Obamacare will impact their practices so they can adjust accordingly. This includes consideration of the number of newly insured patients they will encounter, the medical complexity of those patients, the potential mental health issues, and the social, linguistic, and cultural features of that group.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES: At the conclusion of this meeting, attendees should be able to:

- Illustrate how access to health care affects health outcomes. Doctors who attend will be able to select a community and assess the likelihood that Obamacare will improve health outcomes for that group.
- Formulate a new understanding of the medical profession that includes the responsibility to increase access to health care. Doctors will be able to describe new health care options to patients.
- Prepare to participate in the creation of health policy, and why it is important that more doctors do so.
- Interpret various aspects of health care reform and how they relate to different patient populations. Translate technical parts of the reform into terms that are understandable to patients.
- Integrate health policy awareness into ongoing professional development.
- Identify how to keep up to date with policy changes over time.
- Assess how Obamacare will impact their practices and be able to adjust accordingly.
- Prepare to accommodate all the newly insured patients they will encounter, adequately address the medical complexity of those patients, their potential mental health issues, the social, linguistic and cultural features of that group.
