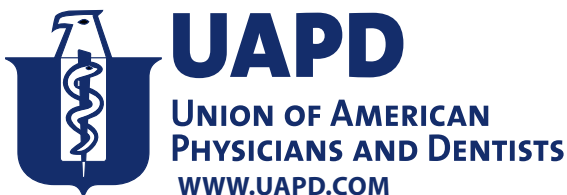


“changes would

That’s the phrase that the UC Regents must include every time they announce plans to take something away from UC workers. That’s because organized workers have a right to bargain over changes to retirement benefits and other cuts that the Regents want to impose. Organized workers can and do resist many concessions. Workers without a union have things decided for them by the Regents.

On July 1, 2013 the Regents plan to implement dramatic retiree health benefit cuts, which will automatically affect UC workers who are not protected by a union. Student health services doctors are now organizing to become part of the 60,000 UC workers with union representation. Sign and return your UAPD union authorization card to support this effort.
